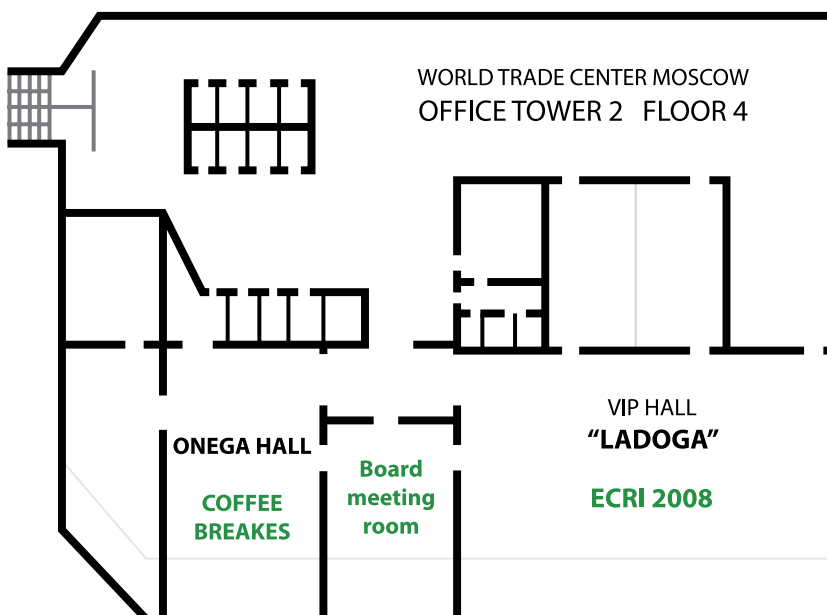

## PRACTICAL ADVICE FOR TOURISTS THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION

- The area of the country is 17 mln. sq. m.
- The population is 143 mln. people
- The capital is Moscow (over 9 mln. people)
- The climate is moderate-and-continental, average annual temperature of the air is... degrees C
- The official language is Russian. As a rule hotel managers speak English, French and German.
- The country's official monetary unit is the Russian rouble.

### Banks' working hours:

Monday-Friday: 9.00-18.00

Saturday 10.00-13.00

To get cash use ATMs, which are available in practically all the hotels. Cash can be received in Russian roubles, US dollars and in Euros.

Most shops accept the leading credit and debit cards-Visa Master Card. You can pay your purchases in cash in Russian roubles in gift shops.

Take your passport with you. In some shops you may be required to submit your ID.

### Mobile communication:

Companies "Beeline", "MTS", "Megafon" operate in the GSM standard providing quite a steady signal reception in practically all recreation areas. International roaming per minute is from \$5 and up.

#### • **The Internet:**

In some hotels the Internet is included into the accommodation expenses. There are the Internet-centers in all the hotels.

#### • **Electricity:**

The electrical current in Russia is 220V AC. The European standard 2-prong plug is used. Be sure to bring a converter with you, as it is difficult to purchase in Russia.

#### • **Medicines:**

If medicines are prescribed to you or if you have chronic diseases bring all the necessary medicines with you.

#### • **The tip:**

You are expected to leave 10% of the bill in restaurants as a tip. It is advised to tip the hotel personnel (porters, chambermaids, waiters, and bartenders) in person. It is accepted to leave a tip to tour buses drivers.

## Transport:

### METRO



Taking into account dead traffic jams in big cities in Russia, common, perhaps, for any cosmopolitan city, metro appears the most beneficial way to get where one needs with least time consumption.

**Metro open hours:** 5.30 am – 1.30 am

**Attention:** line to line passages close at 1.00 am.

To buy ticket is possible at every station where passengers can acquire transport cards valid for 1 to 20 trips.

**The cost of 1 trip:** 19 rubles (0.8 USD).

### **BUS, TROLLEYBUS, TRAM**

Overland transport can be an alternative to get to the desired place, but in big cities one may encounter problems during rush hours because of busy traffic.

Most buses, trams and trolleybuses in Moscow are equipped with automatic check control systems, which means that one'd better care for tickets beforehand.

Ticket offices are often located at bus and tram stops.

**The cost of 1 trip:** 25 rubles (1,2 USD approximately)

**Attention:** the price varies widely from region to region

**The fine for an unpaid trip:** around 100 rubles (3.8 USD)

**Rush hours for overland transport:** 7-10 am and 5-8 pm.

### **TAXI**

Taxi stations are generally located near railway stations and airports.

It is possible to rent a taxi at the information desk in the hotel.

### **MINIBUS TAXI (marshrutka)**

So called “marshrutka” is one of the popular ways of travelling in Russia.

Nowadays you will find this means of transport in almost every Russian city and town.

If you know the number of the chosen route, you can catch it at any place – just lift your hand and the needed marshrutka will stop.

**To pay for the trip:**

It's customary to pay for your trip immediately after you get into the minibus taxi.

The cost of one trip: 20-25 rubles (0.8-1,2 USD) and money are handed directly to the driver.

### **Samurais. Treasures of the Japanese Military Elite**

This historical exhibition includes ancient blades, slams, armour, theatre masks and costumes, rare items of applied arts that were used during tea ceremonies, female clothes, and dowry of noble fiancées from the famous clans of samurais. 73 items of the Tokyo National Museum collection were delivered to Moscow with great care – the age of the items is about 1000 years, some of them are listed among Japan National treasures. ## **Timur Novikov**

Timur Novikov started with painting, became popular as an author of unusual St.-Petersburg's landscapes; then he outgrew avant-garde, expressionism, primitivism, he arranged countless unions, including "New Artists" and "Mayakovsky's Friends Club". Timur staged concerts for Pop-Mechanics and Kino. In the middle of 1980s he began working with fabric, experimenting with texture, space, scale, visual stereotypes of perception. In the end of 1980s Novikov invented neo-academism, took a great interest in church embroidery, serigraph, started working with religious theme. He proclaimed a return to classical art – he staged ballets, plays, balls and fashion shows. By the end of his life Novikov went blind because of serious disease, but he never stopped creating and entered the history of Russian art as an obsessed, desperate, authoritative genius with no compromise, no mercy and no blunder. This exhibition includes 30 canvases and textile collages.

Embassy of France in Russia, French Cultural Center in Moscow and the Moscow International Performing Arts Center present the best French jazz men in programme "Triptych". Traditional jazz instruments – piano, contra bass and drums – tonight sound louder than ever, because of the trio featuring three prominent musicians: Daniel Humair (famous veteran-drummer), Jean Paul Celea (instrumentalist-contrabassist) and Francois Couturier (pianist-universalist). Together they perform jazz versions of Beethoven's, Mahler's and Britten's compositions.

### **20:00 Machine Head (USA)**

Influential West Coast heavy metal quartet Machine Head formed in 1992 around the talents of ex-Violence guitar players Robert Flynn and Phil Demmel, bass player Adam Duce, and drummer Chris Kontos. The band's D.I.Y. work ethic, aggressive playing, and relentless self-promotion eventually landed them a deal with Roadrunner Records, a relationship that would extend all the way through 2005. Their blistering debut, 1992's «Burn My Eyes», blended the powerful, modern attack of Pantera and Alice in Chains with the volatility of classic thrash bands like Death Angel and Slayer, earning them a huge European following. The record sold over 500,000 copies and spawned a massive international tour that lasted almost two years. 1997's «More Things Change» saw the band blending speed and progressive metal with dizzying results. The excessive touring and high-octane lifestyle took its toll on the group, but they fought through their demons on 1999's «Burning Red», resulting in the hit «From This Day», their first commercial single and video. 2001 saw the release of «Supercharger», followed by the concert album «Hellalive» and the critically lauded «Through the Ashes of Empires» in 2003. The DVD «Elegies» arrived in 2005, followed by «Blackening» in 2007.

## **July 3 / Concerts**

### **19:00 Lagwagon (USA)**

Southern California punks Lagwagon formed in the small town of Goleta in 1990. Originally dubbed Section 8, Lagwagon's lineup frequently fluctuated during their formative period and, by the time of the band's 1992 debut «Duh» was comprised of singer Joey Cape, guitarists Chris Flippin and Shawn Dewey, bassist Jesse Buglione, and drummer Derrick Plourde. Trashed followed two years later, and in 1995 Lagwagon returned with «Hoss». Former Posies guitarist Ken Stringfellow also replaced Dewey in time for Lagwagon's next effort, 1997's «Double Plaidinum»; he soon departed as well, and another Rich Kids alum, guitarist Chris Rest, was on board for 1998's «Let's Talk About Feelings». It took five years to record 2003's «Blaze - Let's Talk About Leftovers». Cape then issued a split acoustic album, aptly titled «Acoustic», with No Use for a Name's Tony Sly in 2004. Both «Live in a Dive» and «Resolve» were released in 2005. The latter album was dedicated to drummer Plourde; sadly, he had committed suicide earlier in the year.
